

400 FARMERS OF NORTH BUY FLORIDA LAND

10,000 Acres of Land In
Okeechobee District Are
Bought By New Settlers

OKEECHOBEE, Fla., Dec. 28.—(AP)—Four hundred farmers of Ohio, Wisconsin and Iowa, mostly of Swedish and German descent, have purchased 10,000 acres of land north of this town and forty families now are reported enroute here to start the settlement planned for the tract, it was announced here today when clearing of the land was started under the direction of an experienced agriculturist.

Other families will emigrate south as soon as the land is made ready for cultivation, it was said.

Conversion of six farm houses and a community hall has been started and plans have been made for the sub-irrigation of the tract on a cooperative basis. State highways number 29 and the Florida East Coast railway pass through the property.

Former owners of the property said that seventy per cent of the new property owners had paid for their property, and that the tract had been sub-divided into farms of from 50 to 150 acres. It is the purpose of the colonists to engage in general farming and dairying.
