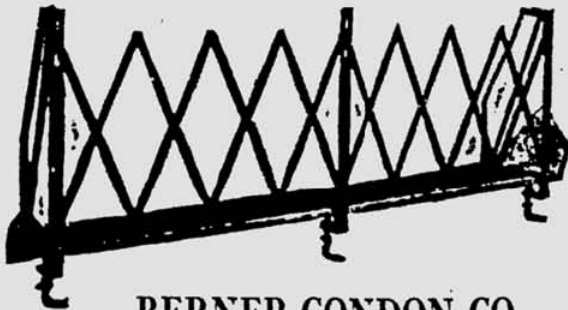

**BUILDING RAPIDLY ON  
OKEECHOBEE HIGHWAY**

**Connors Offers \$100,000 Bon-  
us for Completing Road by  
December 1**

Work on the Connors road from West Palm Beach to Okeechobee City is progressing rapidly, according to Judge J. E. Lovoron of that city who is in Miami to attend the criminal court. "Fingy" Connors of Buffalo and Palm Beach, it is stated has offered a \$100,000 bonus to the contractors for completing the road by December 1 with an additional bonus for each day gained by completing it before that time.

This toll road running along the canal banks and the lake shore for most of its distance, is to be kept up by tolls not in excess of one cent a mile with an annual toll of not more than \$10 for people living along the route. There is also provision for a spur road to the rich section around Pahokee and Canal Point.

Actual construction is in progress on the F. E. C. railroad Okeechobee to Miami, an extension of the present F. E. C. road which runs through 139 miles of territory south of New Smyrna not dotted with turpentine stills and saw mills that afford the line an excellent tonnage, according to the judge.

Okeechobee City is on the line of the cross state highway or Ocean-Lake-Gulf route leading from Fort Pierce across the state via Lake Annie, and Arcadia to Tampa. The Okeechobee link of that 66-foot highway was completed the first of this year.

With access to the city being made so much more possible, Judge Lovoron states that the commercial activities are increasing rapidly. Cattle and commercial fishing, which have been the greatest industries are now being supplemented by steadily increasing citrus grove developments especially to the north of the city.

**CHARLES BRICKELL MAY  
LOOK AT TRUSTEE BOOKS**

**Agreement is Reached for Ex-  
amination by Auditor Out-  
side of Court**

Agreement has been reached between the contending factors in the Mary Brickell estate controversy whereby Charles Brickell, one of the heirs, can have an auditor examine the books of the trustees of the estate to determine whether the report filed by the trustees is true or false. One of the grounds on which Charles Brickell asks the removal of Congressman Frank Clark, Maude E. Brickell and William B. Brickell as trustees is that they filed a false and untrue report.

Under the agreement the auditor will examine the books of the trustees in the presence of lawyers on each side of the ouster controversy. Further hearing in the ouster proceedings was postponed by County Judge W. F. Blanton until May 7.

**Somerville, Mass.,  
Suggests Trading  
Teachers With Dade**

Women teachers in the grade schools of Somerville, Mass., have submitted a plan to the local school authorities for an exchange system whereby some Miami teachers would go to Somerville for part of the time while some of the Somerville teachers came here in their place.

The scheme would work out similar to that of exchange professorships between leading universities of different countries. There is one thing that stands in the way of the plan, Supt. C. M. Fisher said today, that is, that Somerville's maximum salary for grade teachers is \$1,500, which is the maximum for high school teachers here.

**RAPID PROGRESS BEING  
MADE BY BIG DREDGE**

**Temporary Barge Passover on  
Tamiami Trail to be Replaced  
by a Wooden Structure**

Bowling along with a cut estimated to be around 200 to 300 feet a day, the big bank spud dipper dredge of Megathlin and Clark Dredging Company, now working on the cross canal, originating at the Tamiami canal about 13 miles west from Miami, and whose ultimate destination is the junction at the Dixie highway, with the Snapper creek canal, nine and a quarter miles southeast, has negotiated more than 1,500 feet of the distance since actual work started on the 16th of this month.

Although the contract calls for completion of this cut within eight months, barring accidents, it is predicted that the cut will be finished ahead of time, although not early enough for drainage to be effected when the fall rains start. The cutting, however, will be well below an avocado grove by July, whose owners are jubilant that they will have no tussle with overflow water such as they experienced last year, when root banking saved the trees from destruction.

Where the dredge went through the Tamiami trail, a temporary roadway has been made by the mooring of a barge with necessary approaches to allow traffic to move without difficulty, and which will carry any sort of load usually moving to the west. Sunday, it is reported a good sized garage was moved over this temporary bridge, weighing in the neighborhood of nine tons. The present temporary structure will be replaced within the next 30 days by a permanent modern one.
