PALMS OWNER PURCHASES HOSTELRY IN OKEECHOBEE

The beginning of a new era for travelers in the Everglades region was foreseen yesterday in the announcement that L. A. Brown, proprietor of the Palms hotel, had purchased the new Southland hotel, now under construction in Okeechobee, and will open it on or before December 1.

The New Southland, which transferred hands for a sum around \$400,000, was being constructed by J. G. McNeff of Okeechobee. Two stories high, of Spanish stucco design, it will be the first modern hostelry in the Everglades. Standing at the intersection of four highways, the Conners, Fort Pierce, Orlando and state road No. 8, it will be directly in line with cross-state traffic.

The hotel has 100 rooms, each with a private bath, while the first floor will house shops, the post office and offices of the chamber of commerce. It is surrounded with a colonnade in keeping with the Spanish design.

Edward Beck, of New York, who worked with Mr. Brown in consummating the deal, is to be the manager of the New Southland.
