

THE PUBLIC HESITATES

Buyers Withdraw and Professionals Drive Prices Down in Stock Market; Outsiders Show No Interest in Selling; Flood of Orders for Oil Shares Appear.

NEW YORK, June 8.—A striking demonstration of the influence exerted by the public in the securities market was afforded in today's Stock Market, where trading was in the hands of professionals, who drove prices down on the theory that the lack of outside interest would prevent prices from working higher.

At the least sign of hesitancy on the part of the market, the kitchens public withdrew and refused to be lured back until the market resumed its definite upward course. The outsiders are not interested in selling, as was demonstrated at the offering of a new issue of securities, which was abandoned at the last moment.

The petroleum stocks were the one exception to the general rule. A large over-Sunday order had accumulated and were of course dumped on the market today. These orders were the result of advices broadcast by commission houses to their clients to buy oil stocks and the orders poured in from all parts of the country.

Advice was sent out by the brokers on news that gasoline prices had been raised again in the Middle East and that production of crude oil was declining in the Smackover field.

Money held firm at 4 per cent throughout the day and no relief is expected in that quarter until the government completes its customary June financing.

New issues of certificates of indebtedness, the old tax collection bonds will be made and an understanding is reached that the government interest will be paid by the government on Liberty Bonds and the United States Government will pay interest on its war debt; the total amount on the 16th will be approximately \$1,000,000,000.

Two other important events are also immediately ahead. The government will issue its monthly grain crop report at 3 o'clock tomorrow. It is expected that the report will show a decrease in the grain crop from the previous year. The grain report will give the yield of wheat, corn, cotton, etc., and the actual yield of winter wheat this year. Expectations are that the U. S. Steel tonnage report is expected to reveal another decrease in tonnage, probably estimated between 300,000 and 400,000 tons.
