One can only explain or excuse or forgive such things by attributing them to that deep love for his own country which makes him insensible, to every senso of gratitude.

If there is any basis for cancellation of these debts it must for the sake

of these debts it must for the sake of the future and not because of any possible dereliction of duty or any failure of honor upon the part of the United States for things that are

If they want to cancel these debts It they want to cancel these debts, let them include all debt and all reparations and show that the benefit of the cancellation will go to humanity and to the betterment of the masses of Europe and not to the benefit of the imperialistic schemes which are now crushing the life out of peoples who were in no sense responsible for this war. Cancellation cannot be based upon

Cancellation cannot be based upon any just demand upon the part of creditor nations against the United States, but solely upon whether or not it can be brought about so as to help in real reconstruction of Europe and the advancement of the cause of disarmament and peace.

This constant charge of injustice and usury on the part of the United States is simply not only unfounded in fact but dishonest in purpose.
