

NEW ORLEANS, Sept. 13.—By the Associated Press.)—The cotton market was fairly active today for a short Saturday session and although there was an abundance of bearish sentiment in evidence as an aftermath of vesterday's sharp decline, the general trend of prices was towards recovery. At the start prices showed small net gains on the nearer positions notwithstanding Liverpool was lower than due. The building is of Spanish design and is three stories high with ground dimensions of 100 by 36 feet, fronting on Alhambra circle. It was Mr. Duval's intention to erect two wings next season forming eventually triangular shaped building with s patio in the center. Work on the second unit, however was begun last

week.
When completed the hotel will have 50 rooms with baths and showers, and the first floor will contain 12 stores. The stores and public rooms of the hotel will be finished with a Tiffany coating and the rooms will be Tiffany conting and the rooms will be nainted with two tone fawn and ivory colors. The furnishing throughout will be from the looms of the La France Textile Co. A lobby 14 by 25 feet will extend from the street into the flowered patio and a large margue will extend out over the payement. On the second floor overlooking the honk and pastoffice will looking the bank and postoffice will be a large balcony for the use of the guests of the hotel. Mr. Duval is also installing a large

"These insects can be reached." says the advice, "by a contact insecticide only. The strongest of these is enclaim cyanide (a black powder.), A 25 per cent dust is recommended.
