

The LAND CRAB is a real problem and is one of the greatest enemies of the truck grower. It would be hard to estimate the damage he does to Dade County crops every year. His prevalence the year round makes it almost useless to recommend a special time to undertake his eradication. The time he does the greatest damage, however, is when young plants are set out, as they are cut down and completely destroyed, making it necessary to reset. The time, then, that strong control measures should be taken would be from October 1st to March 21st.




