MIAMI HARBOR DATA GIVEN

A great many vessels preparing to load cargo for Miami are making entry at Filletta, Croft & Company, general consigning agents of Pensacola, as to the safe depth of water for a vessel to enter Miami harbor, municipal and private dock facilities here, and tug facilities and towing rates. Miami's harbor has a safe depth of 17 to 18 feet at present. C. B. Biddell, secretary of the chamber of commerce informed the company. He added that the wharf and tug facilities and rates duplicate so greatly that little definite information is available at present.

COMPANY WANTS WAREHOUSE

Warehouses are at a premium in Miami, judging from the appeal received yesterday by the chamber of commerce from the Keystone Beverage Company, a Pennsylvania jobbing concern. Its president recently visited this city and made arrangements for leasing a warehouse, only to find on returning home, that the lease had been cancelled. The company appeals to the chamber of commerce for information as to another location, within four or five miles of Miami, and with five or six loads capacity.

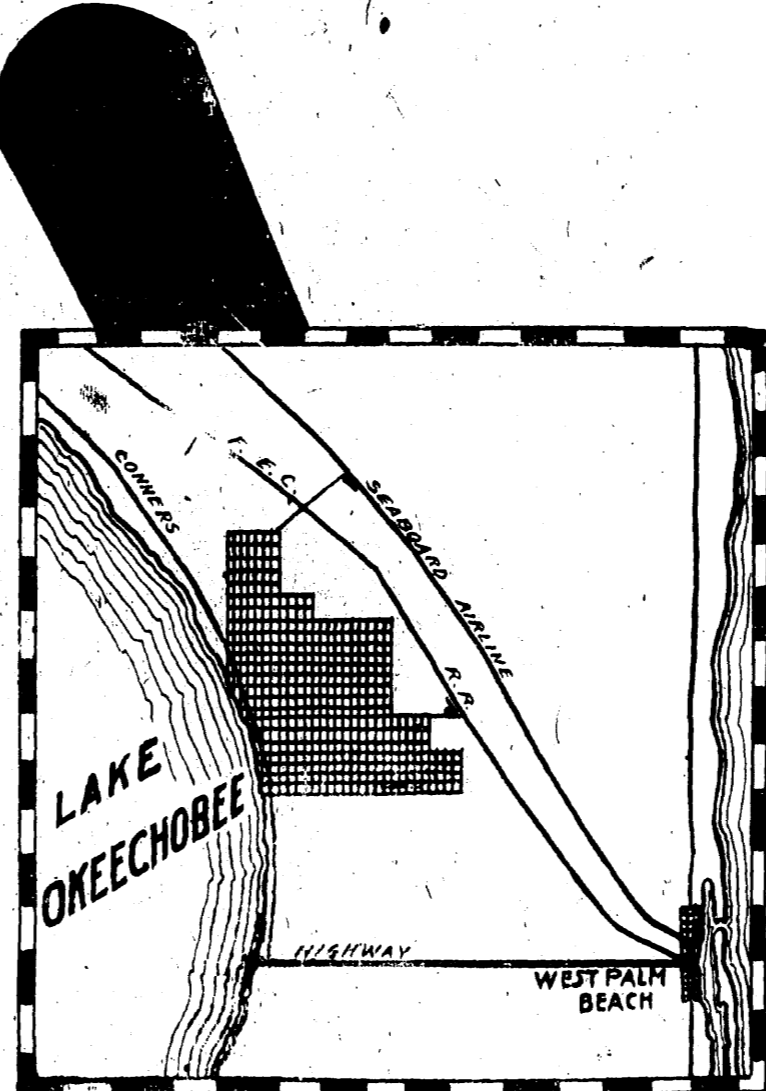
