

MEDICAL AID OFFERED

Daytona Beach Red Cross Unit Assumes Charge of Halcyon Hotel; Upstate Doctors and Nurses Arrive For Work In Caring For Storm Victims.

ARRIVING in Miami yesterday morning at 10 o'clock, the Daytona Beach Red Cross unit immediately took charge of the temporary hospital located in the Halcyon Hotel. C. A. Hyatt is in charge of the workers and is assisted by Dr. E. S. Weisglass and Dr. Myers. Nurses accompanying the corps were: Mrs. Mildred B. Fowler, Mrs. S. R. McCane and Mrs. C. A. Hyatt.

MIAMI medical forces joined with the Daytona Beach Red Cross unit in caring for approximately 100 persons. In the local group are: Dr. John R. Pearson, Dr. B. Pollard, Mrs. Catherine R. RECONSTRUCTION has been started by citizens. Various committees acting under the general supervision of the citizens' emergency committee, organized under the auspices of the Redlands District Chamber of Commerce as the storm was diminishing, are in complete charge of the distribution of food supplies and building materials.

Sanitary conditions are being re-established by the city. A survey by the reconstruction committee estimates that 75 per cent of the buildings in the district suffered more or less damage, with the principal loss in the residential section.

HOLLYWOOD REBUILDING RELIEF TRAIN IS DUE

Force of 2,000 Men Engaged in Rehabilitation Work in Systematic Program of Reconstruction; Five Additional Dead Reported, Bringing Total For City To 34.

HOLLYWOOD, Fla., Sept. 21.—As relief work goes steadily forward here an aggressive and determined Hollywood today added additional man power to the task of reconstruction, when all unskilled men in the city were drafted into the work of rehabilitation started so earnestly yesterday.

THE official list of dead was increased to 34 today, when five additional deaths were reported. One of these was J. J. Jordan, 48, who died in one of the hospitals from injuries.
