

### MIAMIANS TO SPEAK AT WELFARE MEETING

#### Florida Conference On Social Work Will Be Held At St. Augustine.

The eleventh annual Florida conference on social work will be held in St. Augustine, Fla., February 13 to 16, and is for all persons interested in social, civic, educational and humanitarian work in the state. The program is made up of speakers of prominence in the state and nation. Marcus C. Fagg of Jacksonville, superintendent of the Child Welfare Society of Florida, is president of the conference, and Judge Edith M. Atkinson of Miami is secretary.

Among those from Miami on the program are: Monday afternoon, Miss Mary L. Raymond, executive secretary of the Miami Community Chest, and Miss Frances Brennan, superintendent, will talk on the Dade county detention home.

At Tuesday morning's session Judge Atkinson will report on the work of the conference committee on legislation, and in the afternoon she will talk on "Where Do Social Agencies Fall to Co-operate With the Court." Judge Atkinson will preside at Tuesday night's session and is on the program for Wednesday morning's session to discuss "Legal Aid Service," and Miss Dora M. Taylor, visiting teacher of Miami, will talk on "The Visiting Teacher in Social Work."

In Wednesday afternoon's session, Miss Elizabeth Conley will lead the discussion in the family welfare section program.

Price said in an article which appears today in Commerce and Finance.**

Ford is quoted as saying that he has not changed his belief of 31 years ago regarding the industrialization of agriculture and that he was confirmed in his opinion that work to which a farmer now gives a year could be done in 20 days or less.

### HAPPY HENS LAY BEST, FLORIDA FANCY SAYS

GAINES, Fla., Feb. 9.

"A HEN must have a kind disposition, be cheerful, sing and have bright eyes before she can do any real laying of eggs," according to C. T. Townsend, proprietor of the spare poultry farms, at Sparr. With his plant, he says, he has progressed so as to be able to furnish 100 to 500 baby chicks at a time and can do so every week throughout the hatching season. His hens must produce 200 eggs a year, he said. During the month of January a pen of 205 hens produced 5,329 eggs.
