

STRESEMANN BURIAL IS SET FOR TODAY

Modest Funeral Service Planned For Gorman Statesman; Officials To Attend.

BERLIN, Oct. 5.—A modest ceremony tomorrow afternoon will mark the burial of Dr. Gustav Stresemann, foreign minister of Germany, instigator of a formal state funeral as planned.

The body will be placed upon a catafalque outside the reichstag building in order that friends mourning the statesman may file past.

Thousands are expected. In the afternoon, the private procession will escort the body to a small cemetery where Dr. Stresemann desired his burial.

Government officials, including Dr. Julius Curtius, who has temporarily taken up Stresemann's portfolio, will attend.

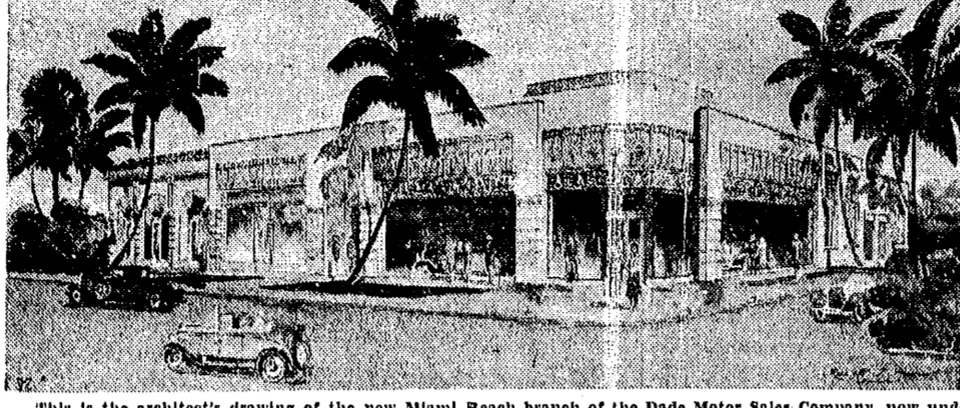

placed by a dark grey business suit when he appeared at the White House for the advent into Virginia. He was prepared to talk earnestly with Mr. Hoover tonight in the fire light of a cabin about the broad principles of Anglo-American relations.

They both have emphasized the importance of understanding between the English-speaking peoples, and such was their topic. The forthcoming naval limitations conference was to be discussed, but not in detail.

Never before in the history of the United States has there been so unique and unprecedented an event as that which began with the departure for the Virginia mountains. The initiation of talks between presidents of the United States and the heads of foreign governments in other days have been marked with a pomp and ceremony called for by the formality of international intercourse.

NEW LINCOLN AND FORD STRUCTURE IS ANNOUNCED

DADE COUNTY SCHOOL ENROLLMENT 22,338

Total Is Slightly Below Figures For Fourth Week of Last Year.

At the end of the third week of this term, 22,338 children are enrolled in Dade county public schools. The enrollment is slightly below the enrollment at the end of the fourth week last year, for which records are available, when 22,642 children were in school. The figures do not indicate that there are fewer children here than last year but that there are fewer attending kindergartens than last year when no tuition was charged in kindergartens. There now are 320 children attending kindergartens in the public schools, about 300 fewer than at this time last year. A charge of \$1 per week is made for kindergarten tuition. Under the law provision for free education is made for children from the age of 8 years up. No kindergarten tuition is charged in Miami Beach public schools which are amply financed.

Kindergartens are in operation in the following schools, with attendances as given: Citrus Grove, 27; Buena Vista, 27; Citrus Gardens, 33; Miami Beach, 37; Miramar, 27; Riverside, 44; Shearwood elementary, 40; Santa Clara, 24; Shadowlawn, 25; Silver Bluff, 26. Six kindergartens have been discontinued because they did not have the required enrollment which now is fixed at 26 pupils. Where two schools have a combined enrollment of 30 pupils and can be taught by one teacher they will be allowed to continue.

The total enrollment is distributed as follows: White elementary schools, 11,184; white junior and senior high, 6,789; colored, 4,385.

JAPANESE NAVAL MEN ARE NEW YORK GUESTS
NEW YORK, Oct. 5.—Rear Admiral Kichisaburo of the Japanese navy and his staff were welcomed to New York today by the visiting officers, escorted by Lieut. W. J. Sebald of the U. S. S. Oklahoma were first received at city hall. After visiting Brooklyn navy yard, they were taken to Governor's Island, where Gen. Hanson E. Ely, commander of the second corps area, received them. A salute of 17 guns was fired from Fort Jay on their arrival.

ated fields of endeavor. He fought his way up from dock laborer, saloon keeper and foreman of stevedores to a commanding position as capitalist and industrialist.

After accumulating a huge fortune in the businesses of lake transportation, newspaper publication and real estate, he took his place as a philanthropist through the gift of \$1,000,000 to charity in the city of Buffalo, where he gained his earliest successes. The million was to be raised to \$5,000,000 as the need required.

The money, he stipulated, was for the poor, regardless of race or creed, administered by a committee composed of two Protestants, two Catholics and two Jews.

Born in Buffalo on January 3, 1857, Mr. Conners attended public school until he was 13 years old, when he obtained employment as a porter on a lake steamer. While sailing the lakes between Buffalo and Duluth, he obtained experience which was to stand him in good stead. In 1916, he accomplished what he believed was his greatest achievement, the organization of the Great Lakes Transit Corporation, controlling about 85 per cent of

MANHUNT IN AIRPLANE RESULTS IN ARREST

Sky-Going Detectives Locate Quarry On Boat, Descend and Make Capture.

NEW YORK, Oct. 5.—The first manhunt conducted from the air by New York City's police department which resulted in temporary failure yesterday, ended with success today as two sky-going detectives located their quarry and brought him back in their ultra-modern patrol.

William Baker, wanted here in connection with the death of William Meahaffey, of Ipswich, Mass., a river barge captain, was the captive.

Meahaffey died Thursday following a beating alleged to have been given him by Baker, a tug captain, during an argument over a collision of their boats in East river.

Baker, skipper of the tug Harry S. Keeler, proceeded on up Long Island Sound following the alleged affray, bound for Boston and unaware that Meahaffey had died.

Detectives, in charge of Deputy Inspector Mulrooney, stayed in pursuit of the tug yesterday in an amphibian plane. They sighted the Harry S. Keeler near New London, Conn., late in the day, but were unable to reach it because of high seas. After a night of waiting the officers renewed their search today, sighted the tug at the entrance to the Cape Cod ship canal, descended alongside and made the arrest.

Baker waived extradition proceedings and consented to accompany the detectives back to New York in the plane for his first ride in the air.
