



CAPT. BASS ARRIVES WITH FLEET TO RUN TO LAKE OKEECHOBEE

WILL INAUGURATE SERVICE
FROM WEST PALM BEACH
TO OKEECHOBEE CITY
WITH FAST PASSENGER
AND FREIGHT
BOATS

Capt. T. A. Bass, of Okeechobee city arrived last night with his fleet of freight and passenger boats.

For some weeks, Capt. Bass has been completing arrangements for placing a first class boat service on the Palm-Beach-to-Okeechobee canal. Everything is in readiness for a fast service that will make connection with Moorehaven, Okeechobee City and Ritta.

This is by far the most important boat line so far established on the canal. Not only does it traverse the picturesque route of the canal to Lake Okeechobee, but includes the coast line of the great lake northward to the celebrated Taylor's Creek, and four miles up that stream to the new town of Okeechobee City. Ritta Island is also included on the route.

Capt. Bass is one of the pioneer fish dealers of Lake Okeechobee and years ago recognized the commercial importance of this inland fresh-water sea.

His boats will carry passengers and freight and make a daily trip from Lake Clark to the above points.
