Connors Offers \$100,000 Bonus for Completing Road by December 1

Work on the Conners, road from West Palm Beach to Okeechobee City is progressing rapidly, according to Judge J. E. Lovoron of that city who is in Miami to attend the criminal court. "Fingy" Conners of Buffalo and Palm Beach, it is stated has offered a \$100,000 bonus to the contractors for countering the road contractors for completing the road by December 1 with an additional bonus for each day gained by com-pleting it before that time.

RAPID PROGRESS BEING MADE BY BIG DREDGE

Temporary Barge Passover on Tamiami Trail to be Replaced by a Wooden Structure

Bowling along with a cut estimated to be around 200 to 300 feet a day, the big bank spud dipper dredge of Megathlin and Clark Dredging Company, now working on the cross canal, originating at the Tamiami canal about 13 miles west from Miami, and whose ultimate destination is the junction at the Dixie highway, with the Snapper creek canal, nine and a quarter miles southeast, has negotiated more than 1,500 feet of the distance since, actual work started on the 16th of this month.
