FLORIDA SHERIFF HELD IN LIQUOR VIOLATIONS

MIAMI, Oct. 18.—(P)—United States Commissioner George Short today arranged for Sheriff William Collins of Okeechobee county to present \$5,000 bond on two liquor conspiracy indictments to him Tuesday.

Collins, who was released in custody of his attorney after he surrendered to federal authorities here yesterday had expected to make his bond this morning, but it was understood that one of his bondsmen was out of town. He said that Mayor C. H. Reeder of Miami, had said he would be one of the bondsmen.

Collins is named, with 11 other men in two indictments of five counts each charging conspiracy to violate the national prohibition act. Shipments of carload lots of liquor, disguised as lumber, during October, 1928, from the St. Andrews Ba; Lumber company in Sherman, Fla., to northern points, are specifically mentioned in the indictments. The liquor later was seized near Jacksonville by federal operatives.
