Senator Borah Says Frenchman's Love of Country Blinds Him To Debt Facts

BOISE, Idaho, August 10.—Clemenceau's letter is so cruelly misleading, as in his reference to the sale and the independence of France, and so deliberately unjust, as in his statement about waiting for America and our separate peace treaty, and yet so pathetic in manifest love of his country, that I prefer not to comment.

To is one whose unfounded wrath we can afford to ignore, and whose malicious insinuations we can afford to pass by. Love of one's country covers many faults, but it would seem that if they have anything to say of a nation whom they once hailed as their unselfish deliverers, they would at least speak the language of truth and graciousness.

One can only explain or excuse or forgive such things by attributing them to that deep-seated love of country which makes him insensible, to every sense of gratitude.
