COUNTY HANDLES OWN TUBERCULOSIS WORK

RENOUNCES THE STATE ASSOCIATION

Funds for General Work Says Hixon, Not for One County Only

Renouncing the Florida Public Health Association and all its works, the Hillsborough County Tuberculosis Association severed its connection with the state organization and voted to handle its own tubercular cases in its own way.

Executive Secretary Hixon, of the Florida Public Health Association, who with Rabbi L. Kaplan, president, attended from Jacksonville, reported that the state association had received only \$1,275.50 from Hillsborough county.

Adjutant Thomas Davis, of the American Legion, was present and with other members of the legion obtained a report from the state association for the years 1919-1921.

There was a discussion of the state association's financial condition, and it was determined that the state association was not to become a broad-based organization.

Chairman Hixon, of the state association declared that in three years, the state association had collected about \$300 more than it had received from the Hillsborough County Tuberculosis Association.

AVIATOR TELLS OF WEIRD TRAMP IN EVERGLADES AFTER PLANE CRASHES

NIGHT IN TREE WHILE PANTHERS YOWL; DIET OF GRASSHOPPERS AND BATTLE WITH BUGS, FAIL TO DAMPEN ARDOR FOR AIR CAREER

CARLSTROM FIELD, June 12.—(Special.)—A little thing like being lost for three days and nights in the wilds of the Everglades, and going without food for the greater part of the time, isn't going to interfere with Cadei Raymond White's career as an aviator.

Other panthers came close enough for me to hear them yawning in the woods, but when daylight came they went away. "As soon as it was light I climbed down and started walking again. I was half dead from exhaustion, the mosquito bites and from being without food since the previous morning."

"Sometimes I waded through slimy mud and water, and sometimes I had to wade through a boggy and light for a footing in the mud of the opposite side. I kept thinking about that other Carlstrom Field aviator who was killed in the Everglades about three years ago, and remembered that all other aviators of him was skeleton, six or eight months later. There were alligators in the water, but they were all dead."
