

F. E. C. ANNOUNCES EXTENSION PLANS

**Railway Publishes Notice It Seeks Per-
mission to Connect Okeechobee
and Miami.**

Notice that the Florida East Coast Railway company has made application to the interstate commerce commission for permission to build an extension from Okeechobee City to Miami appears in the edition of the Palm Beach Post published Thursday.

It had been reported for some time that the company intended to extend its lines on the east coast. It had formerly been rumored that the terminus might be at either West Palm Beach, Ft. Lauderdale or Miami. The distance to Miami from Okeechobee City is approximately 125 miles.

Below is a copy of the legal notice which appeared in the West Palm Beach newspaper:

The Florida East Coast Railway company hereby gives notice that on the 12th day of September, 1922, it filed with the Interstate Commerce Commission at Washington, D. C., its application for a certificate that the present and future public convenience and necessity require or will require the construction of a line of railroad beginning at the terminus of its present line at Okeechobee and extending to Miami in the counties of Okeechobee, Palm Beach, Broward and Dade, State of Florida, a distance of 125 miles.
