"QUART-A-MONTH" LAW NOW IN FULL EFFECT

GOVERNOR DID NOT HOLD OVER TO SATURDAY

Express Company Prohibits Sending of Shipments—Kentucky's Experience

TALLAHASSEE, May 2.—(Special)—Although the Governor intended to hold the Wells "one-quarter-month" liquor bill until Saturday after affixing his signature, it was reported today that it was the opinion of the Secretary of State and the Attorney-General that under the provisions of the bill the same became effective at once and the bill was certified to the Secretary of State at 2:30 o'clock this afternoon, and information was given out throughout the State that the bill was in effect.

The Governor explained to the representatives of the Press Bureau that it was his intention to sign the bill on Saturday in order to give the transportation companies time to deliver the wet goods that were in transit at the time the bill was signed. He stated that the bill was vetoed after the Governor had signed it, and that the bill was in effect at the time he signed it.

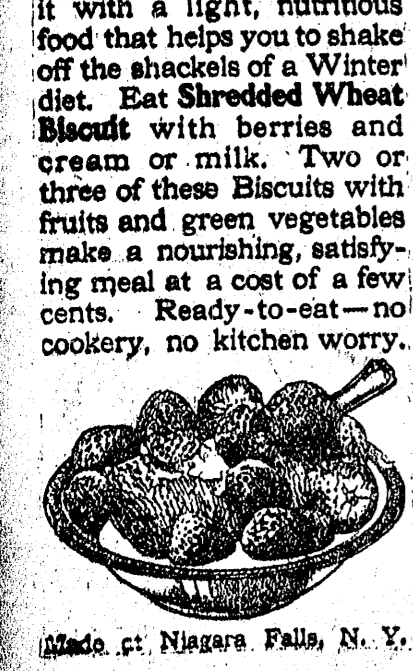
TWO BIG EVENTS ARE COMING IN CAPITAL

DIVIDE PATRONAGE OF THE GOVERNOR

TAKE AWAY NAMING OF SHELLFISH COMMISSIONER

Give It to Board of State Institutions of Which, However, Governor Is Head

TALLAHASSEE, May 2.—(Special)—The Senate this morning passed Senate Bill No. 235, by the committee on Game and Fisheries, by a vote of 18 to 10. The bill provides for the appointment of the shellfish commissioner by the Board of State Institutions, of which the Governor is head, instead of by the Governor.

Some representatives passed a similar law requiring that no shipments should be made from a "wet" to a "dry" county, which resulted in shipments being transferred to other States, which under the law regulating State revenue that justly belonged to the State, and the revenues from the sale of liquor in the State were being transferred to other States.

TALLAHASSEE, May 2.—(Special)—Okeechobee County became a fact today when the Senate concurred in the amendments to the bill for the creation of a new county out of parts of Osceola, Palm Beach and St. Lucie. The bill, which was introduced by Senator Hughlett, has now become law.

The original outline of Okeechobee County was reported by the committee on Game and Fisheries, and was approved by the Senate committee, and the bill was passed by the Senate.

The efforts of Mr. Walker, who is one of the largest cattle men in Osceola County, and Mr. Coats of Okeechobee, who has been prominent in the development of one of the State's newest towns, deserve the hearty commendation of the people of what will be the new county of Okeechobee with Okeechobee City as its capital.

Because Representative Langford of DeSoto, who has served about four terms in the Florida Legislature, pleaded for the western boundary of the new county being made the line dividing DeSoto from Okeechobee, the people of Okeechobee county have forced their representatives to accept the line.

Mr. Coats, who has worked so hard for the creation of Okeechobee County, has been elected to the capital as "Okeechobee Bill." The delegation having secured the passage of the bill left the capital today for their homes.
