

RELAXATION OF MID-YEAR CREDIT STRAIN IMPARTS STRONG TONE TO BONDS

SPECIAL ISSUES RALLY

Treasury As Reach New High Level as Investment Buying Continues in Normal Volume, but Other Bonds Apparently Reach Resistance Levels.

NEW YORK, July 6.—Relaxation of mid-year credit strain imparted to the bond market today, although prices failed to move uniformly upwards. More activity developed with the resumption of trading after the holiday.

Trailers based on special developments supplied the most conspicuous features of the day. Virginia-Carolina chemical issues started up 1 to 8 points in response to indications that early reorganization and probable termination of receivership was in store.

Although investment buying continued in normal volume, prices, many bonds apparently having reached resistance levels, fell 1/2 to 1 point. A high record at 104 1/2, but with most of the other government obligations, fell 1/2 to 1 point.

Highly rated railroad issues fared about evenly, but the most interesting was the 4 1/2% St. Paul & Northern Pacific, which fell 1/2 point.
